In my summertime yard sale ventures, I collected an immense amount of cloth in many shapes and forms, as in curtains, bed sheets, and other times fabric selections from women who had used the same cloth for crafting and other sewing projects.

I was able to help collect cloth for *practice* sewing projects and have seen photos of the amazing results.

I also was able to purchase many infant onesies for Betty Apronti, the nurse and midwife. Many of the women she helps in the delivery their new babies do not have anything to clothe them.

We also collect and provide prescription bottles. In Betty's clinic, they had no containers for distributing medication to patients. These small things to us make a big difference to them.

This week I happened upon six garbage bags full of soda cans. These I will redeem and give the money to Ruth. The same friend, Jay Hall, also donated a giant trash bag full of beautiful stuffed animals and porcelain dolls that will be happily donated to a thrift store in Marshalltown, Iowa, which is owned by Acts2Collective.

FEATURED CHILDREN'S BOOK




Review for Mommy and Mikel Go for a Walk
