I spent a week housesitting and puppy sitting for one of my cousins. They have the cutest Lhasa Apso! Of course, after spending a week with him, I have another story idea!





Doing your Taxes?


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
The Holy Sabbath Morning- 5 Star Review

How to Review a Book

Everyone has his or her own way to review a book.

A review can be comprehensive and play-by-play, as some that I've included in Wonder News have been.

I prefer shorter reviews that are positive about the book's strong features.

They should highlight what you liked about the book.

As for rating, there are different theories. One fellow author stated, "I never give a 5, because no one is perfect."

Having been a teacher, I look at the scores 1-5 as percentages. 5 would be an A. If the book is awkward to read, or if there are noticeable grammatical errors (not in the dialogue), then the rating would go down.

Some books I have simply told the author that I cannot review it, unless he/she wishes me to honestly post the low score.

I do not always review with a score of 5. I have been extremely fortunate to read well-written books, and many have received 5s, but a 4 is still good, and sometimes a 4 in the mix gives the other 5s more credibility. Be honest and be fair.
